Temporary Traffic Regulation Order – S14 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

Temporary Road Closure and “No Waiting” Restriction at - Banbury, N. Newington, Broughton, Bloxham, Tadmarton - B4035

In the interests of public safety, it will be necessary for Oxfordshire County Council to close a section of B4035 to facilitate carriageway structural patching and re-surfacing works.

A Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (TTRO) is being made to implement the temporary closure and “No Waiting” restriction and will operate from 14/07/2021. The estimated duration of the works is 4 weeks. (Monday to Friday 8:00pm to 6:00pm each night). (The maximum duration of a TTRO on a road is 18 months and on a footpath is 6 months, or until completion of the works, whichever is the earlier.)

Notice of intention to make the Order will be published in the local press.

Local traffic diversions will apply as the work proceeds.

Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for those frontages within the closure area, subject to the progress of the works and liaison with the works supervisor.

A copy of the drawing showing the extent of the closure and the alternative routes for traffic is attached.
