# VISIT TO THE BROUGHTON VILLA SITE SUNDAY, 14<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2021

Martin Fiennes very kindly invited villagers for a tour around the Broughton Villa site. Over 20 people turned up to hear all about Time Team's visit and the previous archaeological dig arranged by Martin some years ago.

We met at Fulling Mill and walked up the hill and over to the field of the villa site. All the trenches have been filled in but it is possible to see, from the lie of the land where the terraces were. We were shown the electronic maps of the area, where you could clearly see the outline of the buildings. Martin told us all about the filming aspect of the Time Team visit, which was interesting.

The programme will be free to see on You Tube shortly, but there are already some articles to see if you Google "Time Team". Alternatively, you pay to see more on Patreon.

We then did a field walk and once you got your eye in, there were bits everywhere. Nathan very kindly helped us identify our finds, although some of them were modern drainage pipe.

We walked back via the lost village of Hazelford (more about this in the next newsletter).







Nathan had a collection of Roman pottery etc. and explained what was what

- 1. Tufa. Used to line bath houses as it is malleable
- 2. Piece of worked flint and a small piece of tessera (mosaic piece)
- 3. Samian Ware, which is the better-quality pottery
- 4. Grey ware, which is everyday pottery and black burnished ware (the darker pieces)
- 5. Part of a sharpening stone
- 6. Rim sherd from a large pot
