## First Aid Course

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> February, the Parish Council arranged a free Emergency first aid course for 14 villagers. Following a referendum some years ago, villagers agreed that a more general knowledge of first aid would be valuable, in addition to having a defibrillator installed. The course was run by Oxford College of First Aid and included instruction on how to deal with, incident management, choking, seizures, heart attack and stroke. It also covered minor injuries, and what to have in a home first aid kit. And finally how to deal with an unconscious casualty, and resuscitation, including use of a defibrillator.
